

## A Message from the City Manager



Welcome to the Summer 2022 National City Guide. As we slowly transition out of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has been so rewarding to see our citizens re-engaging in community events again and seeing smiling faces. This summer will be a joyful one as we get back outside and enjoy the beautiful weather in our City with our family and friends.

We have so much to celebrate as a City! I want to mention just a few accomplishments achieved this past year. The City increased our fund reserves and improved our credit rating, achieving the first budget surplus in ten years. The City held a grand opening celebration for the recently completed Paradise Creek Educational Park- the City's first new park in decades. The Fire Department responded to 10,395 calls for service and Police responded to 58,677 calls for service. This is in addition to the 2,500 online customer service requests completed in the community! These accomplishments are just a snapshot of the work that City staff does every day in an effort to provide top notch service to our residents and businesses.

Last year, the City was also provided with funding by the Federal government to help rebound from the pandemic. The City Council chose to allocate \$3 million in American Rescue Act funding to projects in the community and this spring, we asked the public what their priorities were for one time projects that would have a big impact. The website received almost 5,000 visits and 500 votes for different projects! As a result, City Council approved the following projects for funding over the next three years:

- Kimball Park: New Dog Park & Lighting
- Las Palmas Park: New Pool Splash Pad and Children's Area, New Dog Park, New Yoga and Fitness Lawn
- Citywide: New Homeless Services Equipment and Cultural Asset Improvements
- Paradise Creek Educational Park: New Restrooms

These projects represent historic investments in the City's parks and facilities. We will also be making significant investments in remodeling the Las Palmas Pool facility this coming year. We thank the community for their input on the process of selecting these projects and we look forward to keeping you informed during the construction process.

In addition to the projects listed above, City staff continues to respond to medical aid, fire and police emergency calls, we continue to keep our parks clean and well maintained, our streets paved, our sewer lines serviced and we continue to review building and engineering plans. I am exceptionally proud of our workforce. We will continue to find innovative ways to serve you and maintain our commitment to the community of National City.

As a reminder, I would also like to encourage all residents to shop locally this summer. Many of our local businesses were impacted during the pandemic. When you shop in National City, your money goes to help fix roads, maintain parks and support local jobs. When small businesses thrive, they are able invest back into their businesses and the community.

We look forward to seeing each of you at our community events this summer, or perhaps one of our Recreation and Library classes. Or perhaps you could choose to serve on a local City Board or Commission as a volunteer. There is so many exciting things taking place in our community and so many ways to get engaged. ## Kimball Highland Master Plan Update

On October 20, 2020, the City Council/
Housing Authority unanimously approved the
funding necessary through a Disposition and
Development Agreement (DDA) to complete the
Kimball Highland Master Plan Project. The Master
Plan Project will connect seniors and residents
of all ages with health, affordable housing,
transportation, and community engagement. The
Project will include 145 units of affordable housing
for seniors and families, a new state-of-the-art
Kimball Senior Center, a federally qualified health
center, and a Program of All-inclusive Care for the
Elderly (PACE) Center.

This Master Plan Project will transform part of the Kimball neighborhood into a transit-oriented senior village close to the City's senior nutrition center, shopping, cultural institutions, and Kimball Park. The PACE Center will serve up to 500



senior clients, while the federally qualified clinic will serve the entire community. Construction is due to begin June 2022.

## Las Palmas Pool Renovation

Las Palmas Pool has been enjoyed by thousands of National City residents since it opened in 1958. The City Council has allocated funds for significant repairs to the pool which includes re-plastering and a new pool deck. Funds were also budgeted to widen the existing pool which will create more opportunities for programs and participants. The pool is closed for construction from May 2022 to Spring 2023. In addition, the City Council allocated \$4.5 million for a new pool building. Construction on this facility will begin in 2023.

Although Las Palmas Pool will not be open this summer, we want our residents to stay healthy! 




