If you wish to speak, please step to the podium at the appropriate time and state your name and address (optional) for the record. The time limit established for public testimony is three minutes per speaker unless a different time limit is announced. Speakers are encouraged to be brief. The Chairperson may limit the length of comments due to the number of persons wishing to speak or if comments become repetitious or irrelevant.

WRITTEN AGENDA: With limited exceptions, the Board may take action only upon items appearing on the written agenda. Items not appearing on the agenda must be brought back on a subsequent agenda unless they are of a demonstrated emergency or urgent nature, and the need to take action on such items arose after the agenda was posted.

CONSENT AGENDA: Consent calendar items involve matters which are of a routine or noncontroversial nature. All consent items are adopted by approval of a single motion by the City Council. Prior to such approval, any item may be removed from the consent portion of the agenda and separately considered, upon request of a Councilmember, a staff member, or a member of the public.

EXPLANATION:

Effective February 1, 2012, all redevelopment agencies in California were dissolved and "Successor Agencies" were established to wind down the affairs of the former redevelopment agency under the direction of an oversight board. Health and Safety Code Section 34177 requires Successor Agencies to perform a number of functions in that regard, one of which is to prepare a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) before each fiscal period that details amounts required to be spent and the source of funds for those expenditures. Each ROPS must be submitted to the Oversight Board for approval after which it is forwarded for review and approval to the State Department of Finance, with copies to the County Auditor and Controller and State Controller's Office. Beginning with the ROPS that was effective on July 1, 2016, payment schedules are to be prepared on an annual fiscal year basis rather than semi-annually. Successor agencies are allowed to amend the annual ROPS once, but only with respect to amounts requested for the second half of the ROPS period.

Before the Successor Agency today is a proposed amendment to ROPS 16-17 that would increase the amounts authorized for items 175 and 176, which both pertain to environmental remediation costs for the Paradise Creek housing project, by a combined total of \$X. The amended ROPS is due to the State Department of Finance by October 1, 2016. Please see attached staff report for further details regarding the amended ROPS.

Item:

Resolution of the Successor Agency to the Community Development Commission as the National City Redevelopment Agency approving the Amended Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) for the period January 1, 2017 through June 30, 2017 (ROPS 16-17B)

Background:

One of the changes to the redevelopment agency dissolution law that was enacted in 2015 via SB 107 was the requirement that for fiscal periods beginning on or after July 1, 2016, the ROPS would be prepared on an annual basis instead of once every six months. ROPS 16-17 was the first annual ROPS. Even though it is called an annual ROPS, the standardized form distributed by the State Department of Finance (DOF) requires that obligation payment amounts be assigned to either the "A" portion of the fiscal year (July through December) or the "B" portion of the year (January through June). Each successor agency is allowed one amendment to the annual ROPS, but it must be submitted to DOF by October 1 and Successor agencies may only amend the amounts requested for payment of approved enforceable obligations that fall within the "B" portion of the year; no new obligations can be created through the amendment process. In addition, the Oversight Board must make a finding that the revision is necessary for payment of the obligation.

Discussion:

The amended ROPS 16-17B form shows an increase of \$XX for Item 175, Unforeseen SA Remediation cost obligation – estimated additional costs Phase I WI-TOD, and \$YY for Item 176, Unforeseen SA remediation cost obligation – estimated additional costs Phase II WI-TOD.

Item 175: The approved ROPS 16-17 included \$700,000 in RPTTF monies for environmental remediation costs for Phase I of the Westside Infill Transit Oriented Development (WI-TOD) housing project, bringing the total authorized to date for that purpose to \$3,740,450. Invoices to date total \$3,728,230; the developer has demonstrated that an estimated additional \$XX will be necessary to cover remaining remediation costs. The current and revised budgets are shown in Exhibit A.

Item 176: The approved ROPS 16-17 included \$1,200,000 in the "A" portion (not shown in the amended ROPS schedule) for environmental remediation of the Phase II WI-TOD site and \$2,000,000 in the "B" portion for environmental remediation of the park portion of the project. The amount of \$1.2 million was described in ROPS 16-17 as a carry-over amount from ROPS 15-16B where a total of \$2,790,000 was authorized for Item 176. The carry-over amount assumed that costs of \$1,590,000 would be incurred during the ROPS 15-16B period. The developer, however, submitted invoices totaling \$1,xxx,000 for that period, requiring that the



carry-over amount for ROPS 16-17 be revised upwards by \$YY as shown on the amended ROPS form.

Recommendation:

Adopt the resolution and submit the amended ROPS 16-17B to the Oversight Board for approval and subsequent submittal to the State and the County.

Fiscal Impact Statement:

The amended ROPS 16-17B requests an additional allocation of \$1,xxx,xxx from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF). \$X of this amount will be for new, additional costs (Item 175), while \$Y is a carry-over of previously authorized, but unspent, funds (Item 176).
