 He also shared information on the proposed revision to BPC Policy No. 609.
- ARTS presentation of current projects: Roundabout and Kimball Park Southern Gateway

 Rob Tobin and Emma Chammah
 - ARTS plans on starting a mosaic piece on the Roundabout concrete walls that lead down to Kimball Way on Community Service Day on April 30. The design will be patriotic to tie into the War Memorial. ARTS has been successful with hosting community input meetings and design charrettes for the Kimball Park Southern Gateway. This project will include educational and artistic elements. Youth apprentices and volunteers will build in June. They are looking for volunteers on May 7th and May 21st from 1-4pm for Art Making Workshops. ARTS notified the PAC about the ARTS fair, on June 18th.

1. The PAC made a motion to approve the Public Arts Program draft, as a general policy and guideline for National City's art education and cultural programming without the inclusion of administration and oversight; this would include an open process for the administration of the program in which the administrator would submit projects and programs on a regular basis to the PAC for consistency review with adopted Public Arts Program.

1. Public Art Committee Purpose (per National City Municipal Code Chapter 16.07.040 B) The PAC members discussed moving towards existing as a cultural arts committee and that they could use the Port's Public Art Committee and the Chula Vista Arts and Culture Committee as an example. Recognized that the PAC should not be an advisory board of ARTS. They conversed about the option of meeting more frequently, which would mean they would hold more responsibility.
