## NATIONAL CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY INTERNET USE POLICY

The National City Public Library provides access to the Internet as part of its mission to deliver services and materials to meet the information needs of all area residents.

The National City Public Library has no control over the information accessed through the Internet, and cannot be held responsible for its content. The Internet and its available resources may contain material of a controversial or offensive nature. The Board of Library Trustees has approved the installation of software designed to filter visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography or harmful to minors. No filtering system is completely effective or efficient. The Board recognizes that such filtering software is far from perfect; it may allow some inappropriate content to pass through and can block appropriate sites from view. Parents and guardians of minor children, not the Library or staff, are responsible for their children's use of the Internet and its contents through the Library connection.

Clearly marked workstations disable the technology protection measure concerned, for use by an adult, to enable access for bona fide research or other lawful purpose. The Library neither censors access for adults on the unfiltered Internet access workstations, nor protects users from information they may find offensive. The Library cannot accept responsibility for the accuracy of any material accessed through the Internet. Adults choosing to use the unfiltered access to the Internet do so at their own discretion and are responsible for any sites they visit.

Some information resources on the Internet are inappropriate for viewing in a public setting. Because the Library is a public place, shared by both patrons and staff, the Library staff reserves the right to end Internet sessions when inappropriate or offensive material is displayed. Any activities that are illegal, or intended to interfere with or disrupt network users, services or equipment are prohibited.
