National City Farmers' Market (NCFM) Community Guidelines for non-profit groups:

1. Participation at the market must be pre-approved by the NCFM Manager. (Don't just show up.)
2. A diversity of organizations are welcome; except political candidates or causes, proselytize, or soliciting for signatures on petitions.
3. You may not sell goods or services except as a fundraiser for a nonprofit 501(3)(c) organization.
4. Please arrive one (1) hour before market opening and check in with the NCFM Manager. You will be assigned a ten-foot-by-ten-foot (10' x 10') space at that time.
5. Tables, chairs, shade structures, or electrical service **WILL NOT** be provided.
6. Please stay until the end of the market and pick up any trash in your area before leaving.

Vendor fees are as follows: \$40 per market for limited commercial re-sellers, \$30 per market for non-certified artisans, 8% of daily sales for food vendors and Certified Producers (farmers).

Any food vender at the market must have all necessary permits and materials. To sell produce at the farmers' market, the seller must be the farmer (or the employee of the farmer or family member). They must be a Certified Producer certified by the San Diego County Dept. of Agriculture, Weights and Measures office. There is absolutely no selling of non-certified wholesale purchased fruits, vegetables, flowers, plants or agricultural products at the farmers' market. To sell arts and crafts, a seller needs a CA sellers' permit. Food sellers absolutely must have prepared in a certified kitchen— no homemade food can be sold— and be in compliance with all other County of San Diego Dept. of Environmental Health standards and regulations. They will need to have a Temporary Food Facility permit issued from that office.
