### **Kimball Senior Center Report**

- The Kimball Senior Center attendance for the month of August 2018 was 2,227.
- The San Diego Food Bank monthly senior commodity distribution program helped 250 senior citizens.
- Olivewood Gardens did two presentations to both of the senior clubs on healthy eating options regarding salt and sugar. Participants really enjoyed the classes.

### Camacho Center

- Camacho Recreation Center continues to offer open play volleyball every Saturday and Sunday from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm. We have had a great turn out with attendance between 20 and 30 volleyball participants.
- Camacho Recreation Center had 1,720 participants for the month of August.
- Current classes at Camacho are as follow; Youth Hip Hop Classes, Arts and Craft Music classes, Youth Soccer Training, and Martial Arts.
- Camacho Recreation staff are working hard for the next recital, schedule to occur during A Kimball Holiday.

### **Las Palmas Pool Report**

- Summer school break may have ended but that didn't slow down Las Palmas
  Pool! For the first time since re-opening the pool in 2016 we were able to offer
  swim lessons during the week and we had nearly 400 participants in our
  weekday and weekend classes combined.
- We are currently hosting the 3rd Grade Learn to Swim Program, which began the
  first day of August. Within the first month instructors taught nine 3rd grade
  classes or approximately 230 students. Many kids begin the 3rd Grade Learn to
  Swim Program with little to no knowledge or experience in swimming. The
  program teaches basic skills to help build confidence and understanding of water
  safety in and around the pool.

### **Special Events**

- The Community Service Department hosted two Summer Movies in the Park during August. Each event was attended by a few hundred people. City staff and Casa de Salud youth sold concessions during the movie. All concession stand proceeds go to the Casa the Salud Youth Center programming.
- City staff presented Camacho Dance and Music Recital on Saturday, August 11 at 12:00 pm at the Martin Luther King Community Center. The event was a huge success, with about 100 parents and family member attending to support the kids.

### Casa de Salud Youth Center & Volunteer Management

- Casa de Salud is opened for registered participants Monday through Friday from 3:00 pm to 7:00 pm and Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.
- Casa de Salud provides registered participants with a free snack every day when it is open.
- Anyone interested in participating at Casa de Salud must submit a completed registration form and be a youth between the ages of 8 and 17.
- Casa de Salud is now offering tutoring 4 days a week with volunteer tutor Mr.
   James Zieglerkelly. Times are Monday through Thursday 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm

- Casa de Salud will be hosting a Fall Dance with a costume contest for registered participants in late October.
- Casa de Salud will be hosting a Dia de los Muertos week full of activities for registered participants during the last week of October.
