Kimball Senior Center Report

- The Kimball Senior Center attendance was 2,004 during the month of March.
- The San Diego Food Bank monthly senior commodity distribution program helped 250 seniors in the month of March.
- Staff have been implementing new activities for the seniors during membership meetings. Seniors have an opportunity to participate in singing or line dancing.
- On Saturday, March 16, 2019, the Ken Jewish Community Youth Group hosted a free intergenerational senior dance. There were 46 seniors and 40 youth; the seniors enjoyed the event.

Camacho Recreation Center

- Volleyball open gym on Saturdays and Sundays continues to be successful with 223 participants during the month of March.
- Basketball open gym Monday through Sunday had an estimate of 1,318 participants in the month of March.
- Arts and Crafts has 2 registered participants; music has 4 registered participants;
