Per City Council Policy #107 (D)(14)(3) Mandatory Training and Filing Requirements: Commissioner Alvarado has completed all required training and filing requirements.

Per City Council Policy #107 (D)(10) **Re-appointment beyond two terms. Anyone wishing to be re-appointed to any Board, Commission, or Committee and has <u>served two or more full terms already must be approved by a four-fifths vote of the City Council</u>. If all five members of the City Council are not present, or if one member abstains or recuses their vote, the four-fifths requirement shall be changed to require only a simple majority.

Appointment:

Per City Council Policy #107 (D)(7):

The Mayor will make the motion to appoint (naming the appointee) and Councilmembers may second the motion. The City Clerk will then take a roll call vote of the City Council. A majority vote of the City Council will be required for the appointment. If, the majority of the City Council choose to deny the proposed appointment, at which point the Mayor would propose an alternative candidate from the current application pool, or could choose to reopen the application period and return to City Councils with a different applicant for consideration. If Mayor Appointment is not approved by the majority of the City Council by confirmation, that applicant is removed from the pool for that seat. The Mayor will return to a future meeting with a substitute Mayoral appointment.

Per City Council Policy #107 (D)(14)(3): Attendance

A Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission must be present at least one hour, or 50% of the entire meeting, whichever is less, to be counted as present for purposes of attendance.

Per City Council Policy #107 (D)(14)(3): Mandatory Training and Filing Requirements: Commissioners and Members of Board, Committee, or Commission, as appointed by the legislative body, are entrusted with certain responsibilities and concomitant training and reporting. The following are requirements of Commissioners and Members of Boards, Commissions, and Committees. This training is required to be completed within 30 days of appointment or notification.

- 1. Oath of Office (Article XX of the California Constitution, and California Government Code Section 36507)
- 2. Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Statement of Economic Interest Form 700 Filing (California Government Code Section 87100 et seq)
- 3. AB1234 Ethics Training (California Government Code Section 53235.1(b))
- 4. Anti-Sexual Harassment Training
- 5. Brown Act Training
- 6. Social Media Training
- 7. Any training required by State Law, Federal Law, or City Policies.

All training is offered in a variety of formats including in person, via Zoom, training website/software, and pre-recorded video. Currently, these are all requirements of the Mayor and City Council, and City staff.

PURPOSE

To establish a procedure to serve as a guide in making appointments to various City Boards, Commissions, and Committees. The City currently has the following Boards, Commissions, and Committees to which this Policy applies:

Mayor's Appointments:

- 1. Board of Library Trustees
- 2. Community and Police Relations Commission
- 3. Park, Recreation, and Senior Citizens Advisory Committee
- 4. Public Art Committee
- 5. Sweetwater Authority
- 6. Traffic Safety Committee
- 7. Veterans and Military Families Advisory Committee

City Council Appointments:

- 1. Civil Service Commission
- 2. Planning Commission
- 3. Housing Advisory Committee including Ex-Officio Members
- 4. Port Commission

POLICY

Appointment Process

- A. Opportunity to apply. All interested individuals shall be given an opportunity to submit applications for vacancies on City Boards, Commissions, and Committees. Incumbent Appointees are not automatically re-appointed but are required to fill out an abbreviated application provided by the City Clerk, indicating their interest in continuing to serve.
- B. Unexpired terms. If an incumbent Appointee was appointed to fill an unexpired term and the Appointee serves for less than one year in that position, the Council may reappoint the incumbent without considering other applicants.
- C. Vacancies. When vacancies occur, the following procedure shall be followed:
 - Schedule vacancy. When a term is expiring or expires, public notice of the vacancy shall be made, inviting interested individuals to submit applications for the vacancy on a form provided by the City Clerk on the City website.

Unscheduled vacancy. An unscheduled vacancy shall be filled according to

ADOPTED: June 17, 1986

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Government Code Section 54974, which generally provides as follows: Whenever an unscheduled vacancy occurs, whether due to resignation, death, termination, or other causes, a special vacancy notice shall be posted in the Office of the City Clerk, the City website, outside City Hall on the Bulletin Board, and on City social media platforms not earlier than twenty (20) days before or not later than twenty (20) days after the vacancy occurs. The City Council shall not make a final appointment for at least ten (10) working days after posting the notice in designated locations. The notice's posting and application period shall be thirty (30) calendar days. However, if it finds that an emergency exists, the City Council may, fill the unscheduled vacancy immediately. According to this section, a person appointed to fill the vacancy shall serve only on an interim basis until the final appointment.

The end of term for the members of Boards, Commissions, and Committees generally occurs in an annual rotation during the months of March and September. Appointments will be considered at those times unless a vacancy resulting from a resignation results in the lack of a Quorum on the Board, Commission, or Committee, in which case the appointment could occur at the time of the unscheduled vacancy in accordance with the procedure set out above.

- 3. Government Code Section 40605, and National City Municipal Code Title 16, grants the Mayor, with the City Council's approvals, the authority to make all appointments unless otherwise explicitly provided by statute. The exceptions are:
 - 1. Civil Service Commission
 - 2. Planning Commission
 - 3. Housing Advisory Committee including Ex-Officio Members
 - 4. Planning Commission

The City Council fills vacancies on these bodies.

- D. Implementation. Implementation of Council policy for appointment to Boards, Commissions, and Committees requires the following:
 - 1. Per Government Code Section 54972, on or before December 31 of each year, the City Council shall prepare a list of appointments of all regular and ongoing Boards, Commissions, and Committees appointed by the City Council. The City Clerk will prepare the list of all regular and ongoing Boards, Commissions, and Committees appointed by the Mayor or the City Council. The list shall contain a list of all terms that will expire during the next calendar year, the incumbent appointee's name, the appointment date, the term's expiration date, and the position's necessary qualifications. It shall also include a list of all

Boards, Commissions, and Committees whose members serve at the City Council's pleasure and the qualifications required for each position. This Local Appointments List shall be made available to the public on the City website.

- 2. Notice. A public notice for vacancies must be placed in the newspaper of general circulation within the City, on the City's website, City Hall Bulletin Boards, and City social media platforms.
- 3. Expiration of term. All appointees will receive a letter as their terms expire asking if they would like to re-apply for the position.
- 4. Applications. Applications shall be available on the City website and in the City Clerk's Office. Submissions must be received before the advertised deadline for consideration for the appointment. All applications will be retained in the City Clerk's Office for one year from the date the application was submitted. During the one-year retention period of the application, an applicant shall be considered for other vacancies on Boards, Commissions, and Committees. The City Clerk's Office will notify the applicant being considered for an appointment to confirm that they are still interested in volunteering.
- A member may only serve on one (1) Board, Commission, or Committee at a time.
 If an applicant applies for another position on a different Board, Commission, or
 Committee, that applicant will forfeit the prior seat and a vacancy will occur per
 policy.

6. Interviews:

- a. Mayor Appointments: Interviews for Mayoral appointments will be conducted by the Mayor outside of the public meeting and scheduled by the Mayor's Office.
- b. City Council Appointments: Interviews for the four (4) Civil Service Commission, Planning Commission, Housing Advisory Committee, and Port Commission who serve at the City Council's pleasure and are appointed by the City Council as a body will be interviewed in the public forum at a City Council Meeting as described below.

7. Mayoral Appointments:

The Mayor will make the motion to appoint (naming the appointee) and Councilmembers may second the motion. The City Clerk will then take a roll call

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vote of the City Council. A majority vote of the City Council will be required for the appointment. If the majority of the City Council choose to deny the proposed appointment, the Mayor shall either propose an alternative candidate from the current application pool or choose to reopen the application period and return to the City Council at a future City Council Meeting with a different applicant for consideration. If a Mayoral Appointment is not approved by the majority of the City Council by confirmation, that applicant is removed from the pool for that seat. The Mayor will return to a future meeting with a substitute Mayoral appointment.

- 8. For City Council Appointments, the Interview Process is as follows:
 - a. The City Clerk will provide an overview of the Board, Commission, or Committee(s) with current vacancy (ies). The Mayor will introduce the applicant and two (2) questions will be asked of each applicant on behalf of the City Council.
 - b. Each applicant is given two (2) minutes to make a brief introduction of themselves and their qualifications to the City Council.
 - c. Mayor and City Councilmembers will ask questions of each applicant. All applicants must be asked the same questions.
 - d. Total time per applicant is five (5) timed minutes with time allowed for clarification at the discretion of the City Council, not to exceed ten (10) minutes total per applicant.
 - e. All appointments and interviews before the City Council will be scheduled as needed to fill unexpected vacancies, with every effort to be made before an individual's term expires. Interviews may take place at one meeting, with appointments made at a subsequent meeting.
- 9. Vacancies for City Council Appointed Positions. If the vacancy is for a City Council appointed position, and there is more than one (1) applicant for a given position, the voting process will proceed as follows: Once the interviews are complete, each Councilmember votes for their choice via a written ballot provided by the City Clerk. Each Councilmember shall print and sign their name on the ballot. All ballots shall be considered a public record and be open to inspection by the public. The ballots are passed to the City Clerk who announces the number of votes for each candidate.

If the appointment process is conducted via a virtual meeting the process is the same except the ballot/vote process. The City Clerk's Office will provide a Vote Sheet (a piece of paper electronically) with the name of each applicant to be considered. The Mayor will count to three (3) and the Council will hold their vote sheet up in front of their face to make sure it is captured on the camera during the live virtual meeting. The City Clerk will tally the votes and will then confirm the votes with a verbal roll call. The applicant with the most votes is appointed.

In the event of a tie, each Councilmember votes again until one (1) candidate has the majority vote and is declared to be the newly–appointed member of the Board, Commission, or Committee.

10. Re-appointment beyond two terms. Anyone wishing to be re-appointed to any Board, Commission, or Committee and has served two or more full terms already must be approved by a four-fifths vote of the City Council. If all five members of the City Council are not present, or if one member abstains or recuses their vote, the four-fifths requirement shall be changed to require only a simple majority.

11. Report to Council:

All applications received for vacancies, whether Mayoral Appointment or City Council Appointment, will be attached to the staff report to Council. All applications will have private personal information redacted (name, street numbers and name of street address, and phone number). This redacted information is in alignment with Government Code Section 6255(a) because the public interest served by not disclosing the applicant's personal, private information and protection of the applicant's right to privacy outweighs the public interest served by disclosing that information.

- 12. An automatic vacancy upon becoming a Non-Resident. An unscheduled vacancy automatically occurs when a resident holding an appointment position on a City Board, Committee, or Commission becomes a non-resident by moving out of National City limits. When an unscheduled vacancy occurs due to a resident becoming a non-resident, the unscheduled vacancy may be filled as follows:
 - a. A special vacancy notice shall be posted in the Office of the City Clerk, and in other places as directed by the City Council, not earlier than 20 days before or not later than 20 days after the vacancy occurs. Final Appointment at a City Council Meeting shall not be made by the Appointing Authority for at least 10 working days after the posting of the notice in the City Clerk's Office.

b. The Appointing Authority may appoint the former resident to a Non-Residential position if a Non-Residential position is vacant.

However, the Appointing Authority may, if it finds that an emergency exists, fill the unscheduled vacancy immediately. A person appointed to fill the vacancy shall serve only on an acting basis until the final appointment is made pursuant to this section.

- 13. Only City Residents may be elected to Chair and Vice-Chair positions. To be eligible to be elected as the Chairperson of a City Board, Committee, or Commission, the member must be a resident of the City.
- 14. Resignations, Attendance, Training, and Removals

Resignation:

If a Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission is unable to continue serving because of health, business requirements, or personal reasons, a letter of resignation shall be submitted to the City Clerk, who will present to the City Council.

Attendance:

Regular attendance at meetings is critical to be effective operation of City Boards, Commissions, and Committees. The City Council relies on the advice of the City's Boards, Commissions, and Committees, which is the result of discussions among appointed members. The City Council anticipates that members of Boards, Committees, and Commissions shall make every reasonable effort to attend all regular and special meetings of their respective Boards, Commissions, and Committees, and to be prepared to discuss matters on their respective agendas.

A Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission shall be considered removed from any advisory board under the following conditions:

- 1. A Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission with unexcused absences from three consecutive regularly scheduled meetings.
- 2. A Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission misses more than 25% of the advisory body's meetings in a calendar year.

3. A Commissioner or Member of a Board, Committee, or Commission must be present at least one hour, or 50% of the entire meeting, whichever is less, to be counted as present for purposes of attendance.

Excused Absences:

An "excused absence" is only granted when absolutely necessary and preapproved if at all possible. The City Council encourages Boards, Commissions, and Committees to refrain from scheduling meetings on cultural and religious holidays in order to encourage full participation by all Commissioners, Board Members, and the public. The pre-approval of excused absences will be by the body as a whole and documented in the meeting minutes.

Excused absences are listed as follows:

- 1. Illness of the Commissioner or Member of the Board, Committee, or Commission, their family member, or their personal friend;
- 2. Business commitment of the Commissioner or Member of the Board, Committee, or Commission that interferes with the attendance at a meeting;
- 3. Attendance of the Commissioner or Member of the Board, Committee, or Commission at a funeral, religious service or ceremony, wedding, or other similarly-significant event; or
- 4. Other reason for which the Commissioner or Member of the Board, Committee, or Commission has given notice to the Chairperson or Secretary of their unavailability fifteen (15) days in advance, as long as the unavailability is not expected to last longer than 30 days.

Removal:

The Secretary or Lead of each Board, Commission, or Committee will report the attendance to the Office of the City Clerk on a monthly basis. If the attendance or absences fall within these guidelines, the Office of the City Clerk will prepare a report to City Council for review and possible removal of the Commissioner, Member, or Alternate sitting on the Board, Committee, or Commission. Any Commissioner, Member, or Alternate sitting on a Board, Committee, or Commission may be removed from office at any time by a simple majority vote of the City Council at a regularly scheduled Council meeting with or without cause.

Mandatory Training and Filing Requirements:

Commissioners and Members of Board, Committee, or Commission, as appointed by the legislative body, are entrusted with certain responsibilities and

concomitant training and reporting. The following are requirements of Commissioners and Members of Boards, Commissions, and Committees. This training is required to be completed within 30 days of appointment or notification.

- 1. Oath of Office (Article XX of the California Constitution, and California Government Code Section 36507)
- 2. Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Statement of Economic Interest Form 700 Filing (California Government Code Section 87100 et seq)
- 3. AB1234 Ethics Training (California Government Code Section 53235.1(b))
- 4. Sexual Harassment Training
- 5. Brown Act Training
- 6. Social Media Training
- 7. Any training required by State Law, Federal Law, or City Policies.

All training is offered in a variety of formats including in person, via Zoom, training website/software, and pre-recorded video. Currently, these are all requirements of the Mayor and City Council, and City staff.

Removal:

Failure to complete any of these requirements within 30 days of the appointment date or date of notification is cause for automatic removal.

Resolution of the City Council of the City of National City authorizing the Mayor to execute a Mills Act Historic Preservation Contract for 520 'F' Avenue. (Applicants: Christine & Liam Dunfey, Joe Dzida) (Case File 2022-27 M)

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends adoption of a resolution authorizing the Mayor to execute a Mills Act Historic Preservation Contract for 520 'F' Avenue.

BOARD/COMMISSION/COMMITTEE PRIOR ACTION:

EXPLANATION:

The property owners of 520 'F' Avenue are requesting a Mills Act contract. The structure, known as the Sarah B. Annis House, is a two-story Stick Eastlake style home located in the Small Lot Residential (RS-2) zone. The 2,130 square-foot house is constructed with wood siding, with decorative wood trim and contrasting colors. The home was constructed in 1886 and has been used as apartments in the past.

Mills Act contracts are historic preservation tools that provide property tax savings for owners in exchange for a commitment to maintain and/or restore a historic structure. This property was part of a list of historic properties designated by City Council in 2018. The residence is in decent condition, but requires some maintenance and repair work. Future work includes repair (and replacement, as necessary) of exterior woodwork, plumbing, electric components, and the removal and replacement of the exterior paint. The National City Historic Society requested the ability to approve the paint color. The Mills Act contract is valid for 10 years and automatically extends for one year on the anniversary date. The City may cancel the contract if breached or opt not to renew it if proper notice is provided. There are currently 18 Mills Act contracts in the City.

According to the San Diego County Assessor, there will be a reduction of approximately 30% in the assessed value of the property, which translates into a property tax reduction of about \$1,994 annually with respect to the "1%" portion of the property tax bill. Because the property lies within the former redevelopment area, this reduction will be to property taxes available to the Successor Agency. The loss to the Successor Agency would in turn impact the amount of residual balance available for distribution to other agencies, including the City whose share would be about \$359.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

This action will result in a reduction in annual Successor Agency property tax revenue of approximately \$1,994. The impact on the City would be an approximate loss of \$359 in residual balance distribution revenue from the Successor Agency.



MILLS ACT CONTRACT

For property located at 520 'F' Avenue

THIS MILLS ACT CONTRACT ("Contract") is entered into by and between THE CITY OF NATIONAL CITY, a municipal corporation ("CITY") and Christine E. and William R. Dunfey, & Joseph Dzida ("OWNER").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 50280, et seq., referred to as the Mills Act, authorizes cities to enter into contracts with the owners of "qualified historic properties," defined in Government Code Section 50280.1, to provide for the use, maintenance, and restoration of such historic properties so as to retain their characteristics as properties of historic significance.

WHEREAS, OWNER possesses fee title to that certain real property, together with associated structures and improvements thereon, Assessor's Parcel No. 556-232-20-00, and located at the street address 520 'F' Avenue, National City, California (the "Historic Site"), on property generally described as:

LOT 16 AND THE SOUTH 20 FEET OF LOT 17, BLOCK 43 OF MCCOY'S SUBDIVISION OF 10 ACRE LOT 11 OF QUARTER SECTION 155 OF RANCHO DE LA NATION, IN THE CITY OF NATIONAL CITY, COUNTY OF SAN DIEGO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ACCORDING TO MAP THEREOF NO. 6, FILED IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY .RECORDER OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY, APRIL 22, 1881.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of National City designated the above property as a Historic Site and it is so listed and currently eligible for listing in the "List of Identified Historic Sites in National City." A copy of such listing is attached to this Contract as **Attachment A**.

WHEREAS, City and OWNER, for their mutual benefit, now desire to enter into this Contract both to protect and preserve the characteristics of historic significance of the Historic Site and to qualify the Historic Site for an assessment of valuation pursuant to the provisions of Article 1.9 (commencing with Section 439) of Chapter 3 of Part 2 of Division 1 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, and of Article 12 (commencing with Section 50280) of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of Division 1 of the California Government Code.

AGREEMENT

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual benefits and covenants, CITY and OWNER agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Effective Date and Term of Contract</u>. This Contract shall be effective and commence on October 4, 2022 ("Effective Date"), and shall remain in effect for a term of ten (10) years thereafter. The initial ten-year term, and any extension pursuant to Section 2, shall collectively be referred to hereafter as the "Term."
- 2. <u>Automatic Renewal and Notice of Non-Renewal</u>.
 - a. <u>Renewal</u>. Each year on the anniversary of the effective date of this Contract (the "Renewal Date"), a year shall automatically be added to the initial term of this Contract unless notice of non-renewal is served as provided herein.
 - b. Non-Renewal. If either OWNER or CITY desires, in any year, not to renew this Contract, OWNER or CITY shall serve written notice of non-renewal on the other party in advance of the annual Renewal Date of the Contract. Unless such notice is served by OWNER to CITY, in writing to the City Council, at least ninety (90) days prior to the annual Renewal Date, or served by CITY to OWNER at least sixty (60) days prior to the annual Renewal Date, one (1) year shall automatically be added to the Term as provided herein. If either CITY or OWNER serve notice to the other of non-renewal in any year, the Contract shall remain in effect for the balance of the Term then remaining, either from its original execution or from the last renewal of the Contract, whichever may apply.

- (1) <u>Protest</u>. Upon receipt by OWNER of a notice of non-renewal from CITY, OWNER may make a written protest of the notice to the City Council. Any protest must be received by the CITY no later than 15 days from the date of the notice of non-renewal.
- c. <u>Withdrawal of Non-Renewal</u>. CITY may, at any time prior to the Renewal Date of the Contract, withdraw its notice of non-renewal.
- d. <u>City Non-Renewal</u>. If CITY serves notice of non-renewal in any year, the existing Term of the Contract shall remain in effect for the balance of the period remaining since the original execution or the last renewal of the Contract, as the case may be.
- 3. [Reserved]
- 4. <u>Eligibility</u>. To be eligible for this Contract, the Historic Site shall be listed and shall remain eligible for listing in the "List of Identified Historic Sites in National City." (*Attachment A.*)
- 5. <u>Standards for Historic Site</u>. During the Term, the Historic Site shall be subject to the following conditions, requirements, and restrictions:
 - a. OWNER shall preserve and maintain the characteristics of the cultural and historical significance of the Historic Site, and, when necessary, restore and rehabilitate the Historic Site to conform to the rules and regulations of the Office of Historic Preservation of the Department of California State Parks, the United States Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation, and the State Historical Building Code, as amended from time to time. Work shall be done in accordance with the maintenance schedule drafted by the OWNER, attached to this Contract as **Attachment B**.
 - b. OWNER shall maintain all buildings, structures, yards and other improvements in a manner which does not detract from the appearance of the immediate neighborhood. The following conditions are prohibited:
 - (1) Dilapidated, deteriorating, or unrepaired structures, such as: fences, roofs, doors, walls and windows;
 - (2) Scrap lumber, junk, trash, or debris;
 - (3) Abandoned, discarded or unused objects or equipment, such as automobiles, automobile parts, furniture, stoves, refrigerators, cans,

- containers, or similar items;
- (4) Stagnant water or excavations, including swimming pools or spas;
- (5) Any device, decoration, design, structure or vegetation which is unsightly by reason of its height, condition, or its inappropriate location.
- c. Five years after the Effective Date, and every five years thereafter, City shall inspect the interior and exterior of the Historic Site to determine OWNER'S continued compliance with the Contract. Inspections required by this Section must:
 - (1) Be scheduled by prior appointment between City and OWNER, and
 - (2) Occur no later than thirty days from the five-year anniversary described in this Section.
- d. OWNER shall allow visibility of the exterior of the structure from the public right-of-way. OWNER shall not block the view to the exterior of structure with any new structure, such as walls, fences, or shrubbery.
- e. If OWNER applies to CITY for a permit for demolition, substantial exterior alteration, or removal of the Historic Site, OWNER shall attend and participate in a scheduled hearing regarding such application before the board or commission designated by the City Council to oversee CITY'S historic resources prior to the issuance of such permit. CITY will endeavor to schedule such hearing within three (3) weeks after OWNER submits such application to CITY.
- f. Notwithstanding the foregoing Section 5(e), if OWNER applies to CITY for a permit for the demolition, substantial exterior alteration, or removal of the Historic Site, OWNER shall comply with all CITY and State of California environmental regulations, policies, and requirements prior to CITY'S issuance of the requested permit.
- 6. <u>Information of Compliance</u>. OWNER hereby agrees to furnish CITY with any and all information requested by CITY which CITY deems necessary or helpful to determine compliance with the terms and provisions of this Contract.
- 7. <u>Breach of Contract; Cancellation</u>. If CITY determines that the OWNER has breached any of the conditions of the Contract, or have allowed the Historic Site

to deteriorate to the point that it no longer meets the standards for a "qualified historical property" as defined by Government Code Section 50280.1, CITY shall do one of the following:

- a. <u>Public Hearing</u>. Cancel this Contract after CITY has given written notice of, and has held, a public hearing on the proposed cancellation. Notice of such hearing shall be mailed to the last known address of the OWNER within the historic zone and shall be published pursuant to Government Code Section 6061. If CITY cancels the Contract pursuant to Section 7(a), OWNER shall pay those cancellation fees set forth in Government Code Section 50286.
- b. <u>Court Action</u>. Bring any action in court, pursuant to Section 14(e) necessary to enforce the Contract, including, but not limited to, an action to enforce the Contract by specific performance or injunction.
- 8. <u>OWNER'S Cancellation Alternative</u>. As an alternative to cancellation of the Contract, OWNER may bring any action in court, pursuant to Section 14(e), necessary to enforce the Contract, including, but not limited to, an action to enforce the Contract by specific performance or injunction.
- 9. Binding Effect of Contract. OWNER hereby subjects the Historic Site to the covenants, reservations, and restrictions set forth in this Contract. CITY and OWNER hereby declare their specific intent that the covenants, reservations, and restrictions as set forth in this Contract shall be deemed covenants running with the land and shall pass to and be binding upon OWNER'S successors and assigns in title or interest to the Historic Site. Each and every contract, deed, or other instrument hereinafter executed, covering or conveying the Historic Site, or any portion thereof, shall conclusively be held to have been executed, delivered, and accepted subject to the covenants, reservations, and restrictions expressed in this Contract regardless of whether such covenants, reservations, and restrictions are set forth in such contract, deed, or other instrument. CITY and OWNER hereby declare their understanding and intent that the burden of the covenants, reservations, and restrictions set forth herein touch and concern the land, in that OWNER'S legal interest in the Historic Site is rendered less valuable thereby. CITY and OWNER hereby further declare their understanding and intent that the benefit of such covenants, reservations, and restrictions touch and concern the land by enhancing and maintaining the historic characteristics and significance of the Historic Site for the benefit of CITY, the public, and OWNER.

- 10. <u>Processing Fee</u>. OWNER shall pay to CITY a processing fee of \$2,270.00.
- 11. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice required to be given by the terms of this Contract shall be provided at the address of the respective parties as specified below or at any other address as may be later specified by either party.

12. Indemnity and Hold Harmless of City. OWNER shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers against and from any and all liability, loss, damages to property, injuries to, or death, of any person or persons, and all claims, demands, suits, actions, proceedings, reasonable attorneys' fees, and defense costs, of any kind or nature, including workers' compensation claims, of or by anyone whomsoever, resulting from or arising out of the OWNER'S performance or other obligations, including (a) maintenance of the Historic Site by OWNER or any contractor, subcontractor, agent, lessee, or any other person under this Contract, and also arising out of (b) any restrictions on the use or development of the Historic Site, from application or enforcement of the National City Municipal Code or from enforcement of this Contract; provided, however, that this indemnification and hold harmless shall not include any claims or liability arising from the established sole negligence or willful misconduct of the CITY, its agents, officers, employees or volunteers. CITY will cooperate reasonably in the defense of any action, and OWNER shall employ competent counsel, reasonably acceptable to the City Attorney of the City of National City.

The indemnity, defense, and hold harmless obligations contained herein shall survive the termination of this Agreement for any alleged or actual omission, act, or negligence under this Agreement that occurred during the Term of this Agreement and shall not be restricted to insurance proceeds, if any, received by the CITY, officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers.

13. <u>Eminent Domain</u>. If the Historic Site is acquired in whole or in part by eminent domain or other acquisition by any entity authorized to exercise the power of eminent domain, and the acquisition is determined by the CITY to frustrate the

purpose of this Contract, the Contract shall be canceled and no fee shall be imposed under Government Code Section 50286. The Contract shall be deemed null and void for all purposes of determining the value of the property so acquired.

14. <u>General Provisions</u>.

- a. None of the terms, provisions, or conditions of this Contract shall be deemed to create a partnership between the parties and any of their heirs, successors, or assigns, nor shall such terms, provisions, or conditions cause them to be considered joint ventures or members of any joint enterprise.
- b. All of the agreements, rights, covenants, reservations, and restrictions contained in this Contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the parties herein, their heirs, successors, legal representatives, assigns and all persons acquiring any part or portion of the Historic Site, whether by operation of law or in any manner whatsoever.
- c. If any of the provisions of this Contract are held to be unenforceable or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, or by subsequent preemptive legislation, the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions, or portions thereof, shall not be effected thereby.
- d. This Contract shall not take effect unless and until OWNER'S signature is notarized by a notary public. Furthermore, if an agent or representative of OWNER signs this Contract on behalf of OWNER, the agent or representative must furnish proof to the satisfaction of CITY, that the agent or representative has authority to act on OWNER'S behalf.
- e. This Contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. The venue for any action shall be a court of competent jurisdiction in the County of San Diego, State of California.
- f. OWNER or an agent of OWNER shall provide written notice of this Contract to the State Office of Historic Preservation within six (6) months of entering into the Contract.
- 15. <u>Consultation with State Commission</u>. CITY and OWNER may consult with the State Historical Resources Commission for its advice and counsel on matters relevant to historical property contracts.

- 16. <u>Recordation</u>. No later than twenty (20) days after the parties execute and enter into this Contract, the City Clerk shall cause this Contract to be recorded in the office of the County Recorder of the County of San Diego.
- 17. <u>Amendments</u>. This Contract may be amended only by a written and recorded instrument executed by the parties hereto.

Adopt a Resolution Entitled, "Resolution of the City Council of the City of National City, California, 1) accepting the work performed by the general contractors on the following five projects identified below: a) Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement project CIP No. 20-07; b) Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements project CIP No. 18-10; c) Paradise Creek Park Expansion project CIP No. 18-16; d) Sweetwater Road Safety Enhancements project CIP No. 19-12; and e) Sweetwater River Bikeway Connections/ 30th Street Bicycle Facility Improvements project – CIP 18-14; 2) approving the final contract amounts; 3) ratifying the release of retentions; and 4) authorizing the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the projects".

BOARD/COMMISSION/COMMITTEE PRIOR ACTION:

Not Applicable.

EXPLANATION:

Staff is recommending the City Council accept the work performed by the general contractors on the following five projects identified below: 1) Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement project CIP No. 20-07; 2) Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements project CIP No. 18-10; 3) Paradise Creek Park Expansion project CIP No. 18-16; 4) Sweetwater Road Safety Enhancements project CIP No. 19-12; and 5) Sweetwater River Bikeway Connections/ 30th Street Bicycle Facility Improvements project – CIP 18-14. The construction information for each project is identified in table 1.1 which includes the project construction dates, original contract amount and final contract amount. It should be noted that all of the projects have been completed within the approved contingency identified in the contract award. In addition, staff has attached the project award resolutions and final contract balance of each project to this agenda report.

The total construction cost for these projects is \$9,219,566 which includes the following funding sources: \$7,185,779 of grant funding, \$877,297 Gas Tax, \$634,156 Traffic Signal Upgrades, \$267,438 Facility, \$254,895 Housing Funding.

If the City Council accepts the work for all of these projects, staff will file Notices of Completion with the San Diego County Recorder's Office.

1. Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement project CIP No. 20-07

The project removed and disposed the previous HVAC system and install a new HVAC system on the roof of the Camacho Recreation Center at 1810 E 22nd St, National City, CA 91950.

As a result of the satisfactory completion of the project, staff recommends that City Council; 1) accept the work performed by Southwest Construction Services Inc. for the Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement project, CIP No. 20-07; 2) approve the final contract amount of \$267,438.19; 3) ratify the release of retention in the amount of \$13,371.91; and 4) authorize the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the project.

2. Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements project CIP No. 18-10

The project constructed nearly two miles of traffic calming, bicycle and pedestrian enhancements on Euclid Avenue from the northern City limits at Cervantes Avenue south to E. 24th Street. Project improvements included traffic calming through road diets, curb extensions, median refuge islands, Class II buffered bicycle lanes, Class III bicycle routes, Class IV bikeways with bend-outs, high visibility crosswalks, pedestrian actuated LED-enhanced crosswalk signs, two High-Intensity Activated crosswalks (HAWKs) located near Paradise Valley Hospital, and a new traffic signal at the entrance to Euclid Plaza (Vallarta Supermarket) and Windsor Heights Apartments.

As a result of the satisfactory completion of the project, staff recommends that City Council; 1) accept the work performed by Portillo Concrete, Inc. for the Euclid Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Enhancements project, CIP No. 18-10; 2) approve the final contract amount of \$4,212,297.39; 3) ratify the release of retention in the amount of \$117,549.22; and 4) authorize the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the project.

3. Paradise Creek Park Expansion project CIP No. 18-16

The project developed an approximately 4-acre Community Park with decomposed granite (DG) walking paths, educational and interpretive signage, trees, native vegetation, bioretention areas for storm water treatment, community garden, playground and passive recreational areas, and other amenities on the west side of Paradise Creek between W. 22nd Street and W. 19th Street.

As a result of the satisfactory completion of the project, staff recommends that City Council; 1) accept the work performed by Dick Miller Inc. for the Paradise Creek Park Expansion project, CIP No. 18-16; 2) approve the final contract amount of \$2,572,476.72; 3) ratify the release of retention in the amount of \$129,288.22; and 4) authorize the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the project.

4. Sweetwater Road Safety Enhancements project CIP No. 19-12

The project provided a 2" grind and overlay on 0.5 miles of Sweetwater Road from Stockman Street to the east side of Via Romaya Street within the existing right-of way, and upgrade ADA ramps to the current standard within the project limits, as well as address damaged cross gutter, and curb and gutter. The project also installed new street lighting, raised median for traffic calming, new striping including crosswalk and class II bike lane along Sweetwater Road.

As a result of the satisfactory completion of the project, staff recommends that City Council; 1) accept the work performed by Eagle Paving, Inc. for the Sweetwater Road Safety Enhancements project, CIP No. 19-12; 2) approve the final contract amount of \$1,273,050.99; 3) ratify the release of retention in the amount of \$61,929.80; and 4) authorize the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the project.

5. Sweetwater River Bikeway Connections/ 30th Street Bicycle Facility Improvements project – CIP 18-14

The project included traffic calming and pedestrian and bicycle enhancements on 30th Street between "D" Avenue and N. 2nd Avenue, connecting existing pedestrian and bicycle facilities near Sweetwater High School to the regional Sweetwater River Bike Path off N. 2nd Avenue. Improvements also included street resurfacing, ADA upgrades, approximately 1 mile of Class II bike lanes with signage, traffic signal modifications at Highland Avenue and E. 30th Street, concrete pads at bus stops, and gateway enhancements at both entrances to the Sweetwater River Bike Path (located at W. 33rd Street and N. 2nd Avenue, respectively).

As a result of the satisfactory completion of the project, staff recommends that City Council; 1) accept the work performed by Blue Pacific Engineering and Construction Inc. for the Sweetwater River Bikeway Connections/ 30th Street Bicycle Facility Improvements project, CIP No. 18-14; 2) approve the final contract amount of \$915,469.68; 3) ratify the release of retention in the amount of \$44,221.97; and 4) authorize the Mayor to sign the Notice of Completion for the project.

- WHEREAS, the Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement Project, CIP NO.20-07 ("Project"), will remove the existing HVAC system and install a new HVAC system on the roof of the Camacho Recreation Center located at 1810 East 22nd St, National City, CA 91950; and
- **WHEREAS,** on July 22, 2021, the City posted the bid solicitation on PlanetBids, a free public electronic bidding system for contractors, and on July 26, 2021, and July 28, 2021, the City advertised in local newspapers; and

- **WHEREAS,** SWCS, Inc. was the apparent lowest bidder with a total bid amount of \$230,704.00; and

Change Order #1 Exposed ducting below roof membrane and made watertight connections at 4 separate locations. Work included but was not limited to removing existing TPO roof section, fabrication and extension of existing ductwork through roof, installation of wood curbs, sheet metal curb flashing and re-installing TPO roof section. To properly install the new HVAC equipment, the existing ducts had to be exposed and tied into. This Change Order total amount was \$22,280.50

Change Order #2 provided for the replacement of deteriorated conduit throughout roof penetrations, (4) feeds to S-1, S-2, S-3, and S-4 as well as (1) roof top GFCI outlet. During investigation it was identified that the existing conduit was in poor condition and needed to be replaced. This Change Order total amount was \$2,232.46

Change Order #3 called for the removal of the additional asphalt roofing uncovered after removal of PVC roofing for framing. Proceed per RFI #4 and details provided by the Structural engineer to frame equipment pads on the top side of the sheathing anchors and install equipment curbs to the structural components. The addition of crickets to the top of edge of the platforms to flow water runoff around the new platforms is also included. The roofing is to be replaced with additional insulation board to

CHANGE ORDERS AND LINE-ITEM ADJUSTMENTS:

Change Order #1 directed the contractor to construct three additional bus pads not originally called out on the bid plans at the following locations: NB Euclid just south of 20th, SB Euclid just north of 20th, and SB Euclid just south of 16th. Each bus pad was performed at the alternate bid price of \$15,000 each including all work stipulated in the project specifications. This Change Order total amount was \$45,000.00.

Change Order #2 directed the contractor to remove and replace existing pull boxes with pre-existing damage as encounter during construction of new concrete improvements. The cost for the replaced boxes was as follows: The smaller HN1324 Pull Box was \$400 Ea. and the larger HN1730 Box \$450 Ea. The unit price includes removal and disposal of the existing pull box and replacement. All pull box lids received the same labeling as the existing. A total of two HN1324 and two HN1730's were replaced. This Change Order total amount was \$ 1,700.00.

Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements CIP No. 18-10

Change Order #3 directed the contractor to pothole additional unknown utilities not shown on the plans. All worked was performed on a T&M basis. This Change Order total amount was \$ 4,056.72.

Change Order #4 directed the contractor to switch from the originally specified 110V LED pedestrian crossing system to a 12V battery back-up system typical of all other locations within the city. The 12V system utilizes 2 LED signs and one battery back-up box at each location. The contractor also relocated two existing school crossing LED signs from Plaza and switch with two of the new pedestrian crossing signs at 22nd. This Change Order total amount was \$ 12,195.95.

Change Order #5 directed the contractor to relocate the existing single through head at 16th S/B further east to be in the center of the single travel lane, move the left-turn signal head to be at the center of the left-turn lane, and plug and patch existing mount locations no longer needed. At 18th and 20th, the contractor removed the existing traffic signal heads closest to the left-turn signal head and plug and patched existing mount locations no longer needed. This Change Order total amount was \$ 4,099.56.

Change Order #6 directed the contractor to remove the existing catch basin frame and grate between 7th and 8th on the east side of Euclid and install a new frame and grate per SDRSD D-13 and D-15. Once the frame and grate were removed, the contractor broke down the concrete 6" to 12" into the existing and reconstruct as needed. This Change Order total amount was \$ 5,541.15.

Change Order #7 directed the contractor to install additional conduit as needed on a Time and Material basis at Euclid and Windsor and Euclid and 6th per the revised SDG&E Service Orders plans. Change Order #8 directed the contractor to make necessary modification per the revised traffic signal plans by Kimley-Horn installing modified luminaire arms on poles A and H at Windsor, modifying pole E from a Type 15TS to a 1A and installing a new pole G at 6th and Euclid. This change order included all necessary work to accommodate the modification and installation to the poles. This Change Order total amount was \$ 16,362.17.

Change Order #9 directed the contractor to install 5 additional vehicle detection loops. The loops were paid at the contract unit price of \$500 each. This Change Order total amount was \$ 2,500.00.

This change specifically includes all traffic signal and survey work. This Change Order total amount was \$ 10,347.65.

Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements CIP No. 18-10

Change Order #12 directed the contractor to perform additional work on a T&M basis per the revised design plan issued by Kimley-Horn for the NW corner of Euclid and Plaza. This revised plan changes the layout to the previous curb and gutter, sidewalk, retention basins, misc. concrete, and gravity wall and included all changes to the concrete improvements. This Change Order total amount was \$ 22,733.46.

Change Order #13 directed the contractor to perform additional work on a T&M basis to construct a concrete foundation around the existing foundation and stabilize the TS foundation within the basin. The contractor also constructed a retaining wall around the new SDG&E meter pedestal as required by SDG&E prior to energizing. This Change Order total amount was \$ 9,401.92.

Change Order #14 directed the contractor to modify traffic signal Pole A and Pole H by relocating the luminaire shoe and topping the remainder of the pole height to allow clearance from the SDG&E power lines. Change Order #19 directed the contractor to perform all work at Euclid and Plaza at night as requested by National City Fire. The city has agreed to pay PCI the plant opening cost to perform all necessary asphalt repairs at night. This Change Order total amount was \$ 1,827.00.

Change Order #20 back charged the contractor for all overtime inspection Per Section 2-11 of the project specification, where all overtime inspection costs shall be borne by the contractor. This Change Order total amount was deduct of \$ 9,435.00.

All Change Orders listed above increased the total contract amount by \$209,363.69.

Line item adjustments based on actual field measurements per the FINAL BILLING STATEMENT resulted in a decrease of \$57,757.30.

CHANGE ORDERS AND LINE ITEM ADJUSTMENTS:

Change Order #1 furnished and installed a construction sign for the Urban Greening Program to identify the project's funding source, California's Governor and the Secretary of Natural Resources. This Change Order total amount was \$922.79.

Change Order #2 provided 14 additional working days for Dick Miller Inc. to construct approximately 13,800 SF of pervious concrete along the multiuse path. As two separate CIP projects were being constructed at Paradise Creek, this change order allowed for funding deadlines and schedules to be maintained on the two simultaneous projects. This Change Order total amount was \$0.

Change Order #3 upsized the 1 gallon plant species to 5 gallon plant species. Due to lack of availability, the Landscape Architect recommended upsizing four of the plant species. This change order provided a credit for the 1 gallon plants and additional cost for the 5 gallon plant species. This Change Order total amount was \$9,672.77.

Change Order #4 directed the Contractor to remove and replace an existing water pressure regulator and existing 1" pipe riser up stream from PRV. This Change Order also included the change of a 3" GW line to a 4" line in the Public Works Mechanics Shop. This Change Order total amount was \$8,036.31.

Changer Order #5 allowed for adjustments to seat wall elevations in the playground area for adequate stormwater drainage. After beginning construction, the contractor identified issues with drainage in the original seat wall plans. 2 working days were added to allow for additional grading and forming of the seat wall at the revised elevations. This Change Order total amount was \$3,835.53.

Change Order #6 provided procurement and installation of 14 additional irrigation nozzles, 4,700 square feet of hydroseeding and modifications to the stair landing. The additional hydroseeding and irrigation compensated for the additional footprint identified in the field, while mitigating maintenance requirements in this area. The modifications to the stairs were to satisfy ADA requirements along the connector path. This Change Order total amount was \$6,882.13.

Change Order #7 allocated funds for various park improvements including landscaping, irrigation and surface improvements within the community garden. During construction the City, Landscape Architect and Kimball Elementary agreed upon the final improvement plans for the community garden. This work was performed at an agreed upon lump sum price. This Change Order total amount was \$48,272.85.

Change Order #8 directed the Contractor to install 190 concrete footings with PVC sleeves below the handrail posts for the ADA path at the perimeter of the park. To support the handrail and increase longevity of the curb below the rail, it was determined that a 1-foot deep concrete footing would be installed below the curb. This change order also includes a credit for the reduced square footage needed for constructing the pedestrian impervious concrete paving. This Change Order total amount was \$21,442.45.

Change Order #9 allowed for changes to 3 shade structure footings. While the plans originally called for 24-inch footings, field conditions only supported footings up to 18-inches. The approved redesigned footings were 12-inch spread footings to support soil conditions, structural loading and site depth requirements. This Change Order total amount was \$5,209.34.

Change Order #10 directed the Contractor to excavate behind the community garden to allow for proper drainage. Existing soil elevations were too high to allow for proper drainage away from the community garden. This Change Order total amount was \$1,823.94.

Change Order #11 provided approximately 100 linear feet of pervious concrete improvements between 21st St and 22nd St. The pathway improvements replaced plans for impervious concrete and included changes to elevations to satisfy ADA slope requirements. This revision included modifications to irrigation and landscaping in this area, as well as changes to the rubberized surfacing in the playground area. This Change Order total amount was \$10,245.90.

Change Order #12 allowed for procurement and installation of 11 12-foot diameter galvanized steel edging rings to support landscaping. The original plans called for 6-foot diameter rings. However, the manufacturer specified that the rings were not to be constructed below a 6-foot radius due to the thickness of the material. The Landscape Architect agreed to a 12-foot diameter and additional steel needed to fabricate the olive tree rings. This Change Order total amount was \$20,332.89.

Change Order #13 directed the Contractor to encase 3 electrical conduits in concrete above an existing storm drain. An unmarked storm drain was identified approximately 17" below grade in an area being trenched for conduits supporting irrigation and security cameras. Encasing the conduits satisfied code requirements, minimized city maintenance and reduced risk of damaging the existing infrastructure. This Change Order total amount was \$1,928.10.

Change Order #14 allowed for changes to the supports below the play structures in the playground. The plans called for an allowable depth of 24-inches which failed to satisfy the minimal manufactured depth of 48-inches. The supports were redesigned as spread footings and were approved for full warranty. This Change Order total amount was \$3,150.00.

Change Order #15 provided additional grading for the south end sidewalk path to meet ADA cross slope requirements and match existing sidewalk elevations. This Change Order total amount was \$704.51.

Change Order #16 added jute netting on the new slopes that had landscaping and irrigation improvements. The jute net provides slope stabilization and minimizes city maintenance. This Change Order total amount was \$7,071.26.

Change Order #17 allowed for changes to the supports of the USA Shade Structures. Due to allowable soil depths identified in the field, the supports for the shade structures were redesigned to spread footings with additional direct embedment of the columns. This Change Order total amount was \$3,018.79.

Change Order #18 directed the Contractor to install a customized pedestrian gate at the community garden. This Change Order total amount was \$6,016.01

Change Order #19 increased the footing size and re-routed the subdrainage for the shade structures after the footings were redesigned. The increase in the footing size increased the need for subdrainage which was re-routed. This Change Order total amount was \$10,834.28.

Change Order #20 allowed for changes to the supports below the LSI playground equipment. The plans called for an allowable depth of 24 inches, however the allowable depth identified in the field was 18 inches. The approved supports were redesigned as 12-inch spread footings to support soil conditions and structural loading. This Change Order total amount was \$1,260.00.

Change Order #21 directed the Contractor to install an electrical pull box within the community garden shed. After the contractor identified potential risks within the shed for the exposed cables, it was determined that a pull box would be the best solution for safety and maintenance to house the power and low voltage cables. This Change Order total amount was \$959.31.

Change Order #22 modified the design to the park rail sign for safety concerns. The original design had various sharp edges exposed to park guests. The redesign increased thickness and changed lettering to minimize exposed edges. This Change Order total amount was \$3,220.00.

Change Order #23 directed the Contractor to install one gigabit PoE extender at the community garden to supply communication for the fiber system and security camera. The original detail did not meet electrical standards and required an extender for the city IT to maintain the system properly. This Change Order total amount was \$724.68.

Change Order #24 modified the spacing between posts for the custom lodge wood rails around the playground area. The proposed spacing for the fencing could not be accommodated by the available space. The Landscape Architect modified the design to have 9-foot spacing which required additional fabrication and material. This Change order total amount was \$921.30.

Change Order #25 credited the City for the modification from 72-inch box olive trees to 60-inch olive trees. The change was made due to a lack of availability of the 72-inch trees in the local nurseries. This Change Order resulted in a credit being issued to the City in the amount of (\$24,635.01).

Change Order #26 directed the Contractor to install plywood backer boards for the vehicular gate wood cladding at the community garden. The backer board allowed for complete installation and eliminated the potential for warping or damage to the reclaimed wood. This Change Order total amount was \$2,327.84.

Change Order #27 directed the Contractor to grade a bio swale at the bottom of the slope adjacent to the community garden and core drill into curb connecting to the pervious parking lot. To protect against erosion and to control runoff the bio swale was implemented to collect drainage with excess draining into the pervious parking lot. This Change Order total amount was \$2,127.84.

Change Order #28 provided signage specifying which trees were not funded by the granting program. The Landscape Architect added several trees which exceeded the 15-gallon maximum size dictated by the grant manager. These trees were identified by the additional signage. This Change order total amount was \$5,950.14.

Change Order #29 allocated funds for increases in the bond premium. The special provisions stated the contractor shall be compensated for the increase in the contractor's bond premium caused by extra work. The bond premium per change order was 2%. This Change Order total amount was \$5,212.75.

Change Order #30 directed the Contractor to remove the grate from the hot coal bin. The city's intent was to ensure the use of the coal bin was for disposal of hot coals and not as equipment for recreational grilling. This Change Order total amount was \$469.67.

Change Order #31 directed the Contractor to install marine plywood on the double gates and fabricate supports for the sinks in the community garden. The city's designer requested plywood on the gates for aesthetic purposes and sink supports to protect the pipes from being exposed to the outdoor elements. This Change Order total amount was \$6,033.15.

Change Order #32 directed the Contractor to grade and install decomposed granite along the gabion wall. Additionally, the city's designer requested that waterproofing be added to the gabion wall bench. This Change Order total amount was \$5,583.14.

Change Order #33 provided tamper-resistant screws at all electrical handhole covers. After identifying some stolen screws at the solar lights, the contractor was directed to replace missing cover plates and all cover plate screws with tamper-resistant screws to protect against exposure and vandalism. This Change Order total amount was \$365.11.

Change Order #34 directed the Contractor to replace the damaged electric pole box. The box and some wires inside were damaged by vandalism and needed replacement. This Change Order total amount was \$5,975.39.

Change Order #35 allocated funds for the staining of the pervious concrete in the park. Approximately 13,100 square feet of the pervious concrete was Natina stained for aesthetic purposes. This Change Order total amount was \$23,185.56.

Change Order #36 directed the Contractor to install 1,500 square feet of mulch. This Change Order total amount was \$3,455.47.

Change Order #37 provided a park sign on the southerly entrance to the park. Upon the city's request, the contractor provided a park sign on 22nd St. This Change Order total amount was **\$1,990.29**.

Change Order #38 directed the Contractor to core drill for additional drainage. The city directed the contractor to provide 5 additional core drilled holes along the concrete curb to allow for additional drainage. This Change Order total amount was **\$289.81**.

Change Order #39 provided additional support for the community garden gate. The gate was bending at the supports. The Landscape Architect designed a galvanized metal spreader bar for the top of the gate to eliminate bending at the support beam and recommended wood glue in combination with staples to secure the wooden panels to the gate. Change Order #39S directed the Contractor to supplement the metal spreader bar with post extensions on the community garden gate posts. The extensions were necessary for spreader bar installation because the gate posts were ½-inch below the top of the gate This Change Order total amount was \$1,313.68.

All Change Orders listed above decreased the total contract amount by \$20,842.17.

Line item adjustments based on actual field measurements per the FINAL BILLING STATEMENT resulted in a decrease of \$20,717.04.

CONTRACT ADJUSTMENT:

As a result of the above change orders and line-item adjustments, the contract price is adjusted as follows:

- 1. The contract price with change order and line items is adjusted to \$915,469.68.
- 2. As a result of the satisfactory completion of said project, a retention amount of \$44,221.97 is set for invoice processing and payment upon the receipt of signatures and City Council's ratification of this agreement and the Notice of Completion.

WHEREAS, Staff is recommending the City Council accept the work performed by the general contractors on the following five projects identified below: 1) Camacho Recreation Center HVAC Replacement project CIP No. 20-07; 2) Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements project CIP No. 18-10; 3) Paradise Creek Park Expansion project CIP No. 18-16; 4) Sweetwater Road Safety Enhancements project CIP No. 19-12; and 5) Sweetwater River Bikeway Connections/ 30th Street Bicycle Facility Improvements project – CIP 18-14; and

WHEREAS, the construction information for each project is identified in table 1.1 of the agenda report which includes the project construction dates, original contract amount and final contract amount; and

WHEREAS, the projects have been completed within the approved contingency identified in the contract award; and

WHEREAS, the Euclid Bike and Pedestrian Enhancements project CIP No. 18-10 constructed nearly two miles of traffic calming, bicycle and pedestrian enhancements on Euclid Avenue from the northern City limits at Cervantes Avenue south to E. 24th Street. Project improvements included traffic calming through road diets, curb extensions, median refuge islands, Class II buffered bicycle lanes, Class III bicycle routes, Class IV bikeways with bend-outs, high visibility crosswalks, pedestrian actuated LED-enhanced crosswalk signs, two High-Intensity Activated crosswalks (HAWKs) located near Paradise Valley Hospital, and a new traffic signal at the entrance to Euclid Plaza (Vallarta Supermarket) and Windsor Heights Apartments; and

WHEREAS, the Paradise Creek Park Expansion project CIP No. 18-16, developed an approximately 4-acre Community Park with decomposed granite (DG) walking paths, educational and interpretive signage, trees, native vegetation, bioretention areas for storm water treatment, community garden, playground and passive recreational areas, and other amenities on the west side of Paradise Creek between W. 22nd Street and W. 19th Street; and



Our in house security is made up of two people from our company personnel and are fully dedicated to the safety and protection of our patrons as they also provide guidance in and around the circus tent show.

Our circus tent is in full compliance with all the sections of the 2012-California Uniform Fire Code Title 24 Part 9 of the California Administrative Codes. We also have appropriate certification of Flame Proofing for the circus tent. A fire lane is maintained on all sides of the circus tent. The emergency exits are well lighted and clearly visible from any direction inside the tent and throughout to guide our patrons to safety in case of an emergency.

Restroom facilities are provided for the comfort of our patrons. The facilities are hired from a local company and are cleaned, sanitized, pumped and filled with chemicals as needed.

Recorded music beds are utilized for the performance and single microphone is used for the pertinent announcements. The sound is kept at an appropriate level and only inside the big top.

There are no alcoholic beverages served or sold what so ever. Only traditional circus concession items such as popcorn, soft drinks, cotton candy, hot dogs, snow cones, bottled water and nachos is what we cater to our patrons.

Our power is supplied from a 150KWgenerator enclosed in a 48 foot trailer with ventilated windows always parked 25 feet from the tent. A 100 gallon holding diesel tanks is next to the generator and a fire extinguisher is ready and available.

The circus contracts commercial waste management services at each location for trash removal. A 30 yard open top container is requisitioned and it is emptied as needed. The site is cleaned daily and it is returned to a as was condition after the final performance before the departure of the circus.

Circo Caballero Trash/Recycling Plan

Circo Caballero does not hire or contract with outside vendors or temporary workers. All staffing will be with workers that travel with the show. The staff is currently trained on proper sanitary and clean-up procedures. There is a staff of 25 people and while some people are working throughout the day, all of them are present from one hour before the first show of the day until after the show is over and clean-up is completed.

As opposed to a carnival where patrons wander all over the property and purchase food items throughout their stay, the circus limits the areas in which the public travels, therefore the major portion of the clean up will be in a limited area.

Staff continuously cleans up the entrance area throughout the time the show is open to the public so trash does not remain on the ground. Trash is cleaned up after each performance inside the text. And, once each day, trash will be picked up in the pinking area, which is expected to be minimal since most people consume items early in the show and are unlikely to being trash back to their car.

A trash dumpster will be contracted for placement on the grounds. Several trash cans and recycle bins are available for public use in the circus entrance area. However, due to the nature of our operation, most people buy their food products and take them immediately into the text where they six down. They normally let their trash fall through the bleachers, where we clean it up after each show. For this reason, almost all of the trash remains inside the text, making the possibility of it blowing around the property minimal.

Since sodes and water are served in plastic bottles and cans, our staff will put those, along with appropriate paper products into the recycle bins and transport them to an appropriate recycling facility or make arrangements with the dumpsier company for their removal.

Since Circo Caballero is a family show and attracts primarily families, in-house security has been sufficient to provide appropriate crowd control. Since there is nothing to see other than the show itself, there are no people just loitering in the area. Crowds come at show time, enter the enclosed midway area and take their seats. After the show there is nothing else to see so they exit to their cars.

Many of the things that attract or encourage trouble or the necessity for police intervention will not be present at Circo Caballero. Alcohol will not be sold or served and there are no games of chance or mechanical rides. While a carnival attracts ages 12 - 22, a prime age for those who cause trouble, Circo Caballero primarily attracts children of elementary school ages or younger along with their parents and grandparents.

Circo Caballero has its own security team consisting uniformed (unarmed) security personnel (includes I head of security). The uniforms consist of matching Circo Caballero shirts and pants. This low key approach to security maintains the atmosphere of family fun. If requested, the security team can wear uniforms that identify them as security.

All security will be scheduled one hour before each performance and stay 30 minutes after the performance. Security personal will be stationed both inside and outside the tent as well as next to the ticket booth.


Security Personnel will have access to walkie-talkies for communication between themselves in addition to cell phones that can be used to call additional personnel as well as local police or fire, if it becomes necessary.


Further, the layout of the Circo Caballero tent has more exists than are required by State Codes and the total number of feet on those exists also exceeds state requirements. While Circo Caballero only seats up seats, we expect an average attendance of 300 - 500 people per show in, making the exiting far more than needed.

All requirements for aisles, lighting, electrical, generators, fire extinguishers and other safety issues are met or exceeded by Circo Caballero. In case of emergency, the exits lead to the fire lane, which is always kept unobstructed, making an easy path of escape for patrons.

Circo Caballero is expecting inspections by the local Fire Department as well as the city building department (if required) and the County Health Department. This will assure that we are meeting all those requirements for public safety.






CIRCO CABALLERO ACCESS ROUTES





- 4) Participants on foot are to move immediately to the sidewalk upon approach of emergency vehicle(s).
- 5) Vehicles in roadway are to move immediately to the right upon approach of emergency vehicle(s).

SUBJECT:

Update on the disposition of City-owned real property located at 921 & 929 National City Boulevard, National City.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council authorize negotiations for an Exclusive Negotiating Agreement (ENA) with Tower 999, LLC to establish terms and conditions to consider the disposition of City-owned real property located at 921 & 929 National City Boulevard, National City.

BOARD/COMMISSION/COMMITTEE PRIOR ACTION:

Not Applicable.

EXPLANATION:

The City of National City owns an 11,761 sq. ft. parcel of land at 921 and 929 National City Boulevard in National City (together referred to as "City Property"). The City Property is made up of two separate lots that were purchased by the Community Development Commission of the City of National City ("CDC"). The lot located at 921 National City Boulevard was purchased in August 2000 for \$350,000 and was formerly an education center. The lot located at 929 National City Boulevard was purchased by the CDC in July 2003 for \$225,000. The City Property was included in the Long Range Property Management Plan ("LRPMP") that was approved by the Oversight Board of Successor Agency to the Community Development Commission of the City of National City in December 2015. The LRPMP stated that the City would retain and later dispose the City Property for future development. The disposition of the City Property would require a distribution of proceeds from a sale to the affected taxing entities or further negotiations with the taxing entities if a sales price concession was necessary to enable the development of affordable housing.

On April 12, 2022, Tower 999, LLC acquired the property adjacent to the south of the City Property ("Trophy Lounge Property") for approximately \$1.2 million. Representatives of Tower 999, LLC met with City staff on May 25, 2022 to propose a 20,000 square foot, 9 story building at both the Trophy Lounge and City Property. The initial proposal made by Tower 999, LLC stated that the project would have approximately 100 units of which 25% of the units would be restricted as lower-income units. The new development would also include 5,000 square feet of street-level retail space and 55 parking spaces. In June 2022, representatives with Tower 999, LLC and Southwestern College met on several occasions to discuss opportunities for partnership in the proposed development and remained open to negotiation of a future partnership with the potential of including student housing for Southwestern College in the development.

The sale of the City Property is subject to the provisions of the Surplus Land Act as amended by AB 1486 and AB 1255. Under the Surplus Land Act, Government Code Sections 54220-54233 ("Act"), surplus land is land owned in fee simple by the City for which the City Council takes formal action in a regular public meeting declaring the land as surplus and not necessary for the City's use. The Act provides that land shall be declared either "surplus land" or "exempt surplus land" before the City takes action to dispose of it consistent with the Act and City policies and procedures. City staff had intended to declare the land "surplus" but Tower 999, LLC indicated that their proposal qualified the property for sale as "exempt" surplus land. Tower 999, LLC shared a letter with City staff on June 14, 2022 drafted by their attorney stating that the City should strongly consider selling the City Property to Tower 999, LLC as exempt surplus land. At the City Council meeting on June 21, 2022, City staff provided an update on the sale of the City Property and the City Council directed staff to look further into the legality of selling the property as "exempt" surplus land and for City staff to further consider the Tower 999, LLC development proposal.

The City's legal review of the applicability of Surplus Land Act exemptions determined that the City Property could be sold without competitive bid as exempt surplus land as long as the City determined that the development of affordable housing was in the best interest of the City and that future development on the City Property satisfied the following conditions of Government Code Section 54221 subdivision (f)(1)(A): (1) Not less than 80 percent of the parcel shall be used for the development of housing; (2) Not less than 40 percent of the total number of housing units shall be affordable to households whose income are equal to, or less than 60% of AMI, and at least half of which shall be affordable to very low-income households; and (3) Affordable units are subject to at least a 30-year regulatory agreement.

Under an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement ("ENA"), City staff and its consultants would perform additional financial due diligence to make sure that Tower 999, LLC was in a firm position to move forward with the appropriate financial commitments and capacity to develop the City Property while ensuring compliance with the affordability requirements of the Surplus Land Act. The ENA would guide the process of negotiations through establishment of exclusive rights, negotiation timelines, development objectives, limitations, and responsibilities. The parties would also structure mutually-acceptable terms and conditions in the ENA for good-faith negotiations intended to culminate in mutually-acceptable terms of a Disposition and Development Agreement ("DDA") that would set forth terms and conditions for sale of the City-owned real property located at 921 & 929 National City Boulevard. If the parties are successful in negotiating the terms of the ENA, the ENA will require the City Council's approval and authorization to proceed with a DDA.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT:

Upon executing an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement, the City would require that the Developer pay the costs of City consultants needed throughout the ENA period and the legal cost for preparing the Disposition and Development Agreement.

Dear Governor Newsom,

The City Council of National City urges the amendment of Senate Bill 357, which is harming our community by giving sex buyers, human traffickers and pimps the freedom to victimize women and children without fear of consequence. SB 357 benefits sex buyers who perpetuate sexual violence against children and vulnerable community members.

Identifying victims of human trafficking is a difficult and time-consuming task for law enforcement. Loitering investigations by law enforcement are key components in stopping sex trafficking and identifying those who would exploit children. Officers rely on loitering arrests which often that lead to serious convictions for traffickers and pimps.

The repeal or amendment of this bill will also send a message of support and care to working-class neighborhoods and small businesses in National City. We are advocating for our community so that our families and businesses will not be forced to tolerate an increase in prostitution leaving them powerless as they will feel less safe. In anticipation of SB357 becoming law in 2023, the prostitution activity that our community is currently experiencing is extreme compared to previous years.

Instead of legalizing loitering to commit prostitution which benefits buyers and exploiters, we are asking legislators to consider other alternatives such as providing human trafficking victims exit strategies that include housing, employment, mental health services and case management. Law enforcement should be allowed to continue loitering investigations with the goal of identifying and rescuing victims of human trafficking.
