- Worst economy since the Great Depression
- In an effort to save an estimated \$148,000 in salaries and energy costs, City Council authorized majority of City to close for 2 weeks from 12/20/10 through 1/2/11 which included a 40-hour work furlough
- Police, Fire, Dispatch and Animal Control not affected by closure
- Nutrition Center Meals Program remained open
 - Dining room & home-delivered meals
